



Information for Students Transferring to UConn School of Pharmacy

Transfer to Pharm.D.

Q. Am I considered a transfer?

A. A transfer applicant is someone who has never been enrolled at UConn, has completed post-secondary coursework at institutions outside of UConn, and is seeking direct admission to the first year of the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) Professional Program. Applicants who have received prior degrees (BS, Ph.D etc.) from institutions other than UConn are also considered transfer students.

Q. Am I eligible to transfer to UConn for a Pharm.D. degree?

A. To be eligible to transfer into the UConn Pharm.D. program, students must have completed Pharmacy Studies pre-requisites at regionally accredited, degree-granting institutions of higher education and must have met all application requirements for both the School of Pharmacy and UConn. Requirements are listed at pharmacy.uconn.edu.

Q. How do I apply to the Pharm.D. program at UConn?

A. There are two steps:

1. Apply to the UConn School of Pharmacy via PharmCAS in January of the year you are seeking enrollment;
2. Apply to UConn via the Office of Transfer Admission by April 1 the same year. Application links are below.

Be prepared to submit the following supplemental documentation:

- Application fee
- All official post-secondary transcripts from each institution attended
- Official High School Transcripts or GED records. There are special guidelines for home schooled applicants.

Transfer to Pharmacy Studies

Q. Am I eligible to transfer into the Pharmacy Studies major?

A. Students interested in transferring to UConn's pre-professional B.S. in Pharmacy Studies program should have completed no more than one year of college-level study in pharmacy program prerequisites:

- General Chemistry 1 & 2 (with labs)
- Foundations in Biology (organismal)
- Physics
- College writing
- Calculus

Q. Can I talk with an enrolled student who transferred to the program?

A. Yes, you can find them at pharmacy.uconn.edu/ambassadors.

Q. How do I apply to the Pharmacy Studies program as a transfer?

A. Applicants who apply by May 1 will be considered for admission to Pharmacy Studies.
